The Burning Bush - Ex 3:1-12 -

Archbishop Martin, Primate of All Ireland, in his homily preparing for the start of the Season of Creation, last week observed that scientists are warning of the destructive impact that climate change is having on the planet. "All of creation does not appear to be singing in harmony – there is dissonance, with many wrong notes," he said. The Archbishop went on to say, "that dissonance, that lack of harmony and noise, can be heard especially in the cry of the poor in those parts of the world most impacted by the effects of climate change."

We are, as Pope Francis continues to remind us, each and all of us stewards of Creation, at a crucial moment of opportunity and truth. As Archbishop Martin says, "Future generations will never forgive us if we squander this precious opportunity', they said. "We have inherited a beautiful garden; we must not leave a desert to our children"

Re-cycling in Truro



As well as the standard bins and bags for bottles, cans, paper, cardboard etc collected by our bin men, we can now re-cycle additional items.

For example, Sainsbury's stores have bins where we can recycle soft plastics including bread and cereal bags, biscuit and cake wrappers, pet food pouches, cheese wrappers, foil wrappers, film lids from meat fish and veg trays, crisp packets and more. The Co-op also accepts these plastic wrapping items.

Superdrug pharmacies will accept medicine bubble packs.

Cornwall still lags behind many other counties in not collecting food waste but hopefully, that is set to change next year.

Book Review: (Francis M.)

Divine Renovation: From a Maintenance to a Mission Parish

Fr James Mallon's book, 'Divine Renovation From a Maintenance to a Mission Parish' comes with a strong recommendation from the Cardinal Archbishop of Quebec, 'Truly inspiring, practical and challenging. I believe that this is where the Lord is leading the Church.'



Fr Mallon's proposal is that in our Parish we first make disciples of ourselves and each other. Then we become apostles to spread the good news.

In Chapter two he looks at the research on why Catholics have left to join Evangelical Churches, (e.g. for 'a personal encounter with Jesus Christ;' 'for community where people are accepted and feel valued;' Biblical and doctrinal formation for spiritual personal and community growth; and Missionary commitment to bring people to the family of God.)

In Chapter 5 Fr James outlines a ten step process for turning a parish into a Mission parish including, very importantly, the formation of small communities within the parish.
